HEALTHY EATING

As you all know, we promote healthy eating in our school. Some parents have asked for a list of foods that are healthy for break times. These could include: Any types of fresh fruit or vegetables, a sandwich (NOT including jam or chocolate spreads), yoghurts (again without chocolate pieces) and other breads such as brioche, without chocolate. At lunchtime we try to encourage the children to have only 1 treat such as crisps, chocolate bars and biscuits as they cannot eat these at breaktime. We encourage all pupils to have a water bottle in school which they can fill up freely. All other flavoured drinks should be saved for lunchtime only. Fizzy drinks are not permitted.

ALLERGY INFORMED SCHOOL

St Joseph's has been a nut free school for a number of years but we are aware that there are an increasing number of children attending school with allergies. We are asking you to be extra vigilant about sending children to school with breaks or lunches containing nuts. We have a child coming to school who is highly allergic to nuts. To prevent an extreme reaction, we will not permit children to eat nuts in school. This includes certain chocolate bars and spreads like Nutella. We ask you to help us with this by ensuring that there are no foods containing nuts in your child's lunchboxes. If it does happen we will keep the food to go home again. We will never see a child go hungry so if your child needs an alternative snack or meal we will provide it and you can pay the following day.
