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Dear Parents, Guardians and friends of St. Joseph's,

We are delighted to welcome you all back to our new school year. Thank you to all the parents for assisting in the early morning routines, this has ensured a very smooth start to the morning lessons and the school term. Parents are reminded that children line up in the playground and teachers collect children from the playground and take them to class.

As regards our building, all the asbestos identified for removal was removed over the summer enabling us to open again in time for September. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of you for your support and patience during this time. We also thank the Parish and Greystone for accommodating us in June so we could finish the school year. We are back on track with the window replacement scheme and having new lighting and ceilings installed in the P.E. hall, canteen area and corridor out of the P.E. hall. Although it seems to be taking a long time, work is progressing according to the schedule and when it is finished it will be lovely! Again, thank you for your patience.

# **LATE ARRIVALS**

Reminder: Teachers are continuing to use the computerised system for recording attendance. Once the classes are brought into the school, the doors will be closed and any late comers must enter via the school office. From Monday 12th October, late children will register on the computer in the foyer and a latecomers notice will be sent home. This should assist any parents who are unaware that their children are late. This also complies with our child protection and health and safety policies and ensures that we can monitor attendance closely for our end of year and Education Welfare Office reports. It also ensures that dinners are ordered for late children who require them. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation and remind you that school begins at 8:55am and supervision in the yards is in place from 8:45.

All parents are asked to ensure all uniform items are labelled including the black plimsolls for indoor wear and PE. It is important that all children have indoor shoes. It is expected that all children have a full school PE uniform — white polo shirt and navy PE.

Presently P.E. activities are carried out outside- weather permitting and our dance programme is available in classes. P1-3 are currently availing of football coaching and P5-P7 are swimming also. School dinners are £2.50 for any children wishing to have school dinners/lunches. As soon as our canteen area is open will advise parents and send out the menus. Milk is payable termly and notes will go out advising of the fee before milk money is due.
